
The community feedbacks analysed in this report were collected by Cameroon Red Cross volunteers during the DREF Cholera and Monkeypox Risk Communication and Community Engagement activities. These are the departments of Mayo Sava and Mayo Tsanaga in the Far North, Fako in the South West and Wouri in the Littoral.


Information was not collected through structured surveys, but volunteers documented comments about the findings that they heard during their interactions with community members. These comments were recorded on paper forms and then consolidated on an Excel sheet. Feedback was recorded during focus group discussions, face-to-face with social mobilizers, mobile cinemas, school sensitizations, radio broadcasts and home visits.

The activities in which community feedback was recorded were conducted between 20 March and 1 April 2023.

The results are not representative of the whole country, but indicate broad trends in community perceptions across these 4 departments.



OVERVIEW




Most of the comments from the community were encouragement and appreciation recognising and encouraging the work of the Red Cross. Other types of comments were rumours, beliefs and observations, suggestions or requests and questions always related to this theme.

General topics :

- Questions about symptoms, animal vectors and treatment of smallpox
- Need for drinking water supply points
- Question about the existence of a vaccine against cholera and monkeypox, as well as the costs of treating these diseases
- Lack of awareness of monkeypox in the media and presentation of cases of the disease
- Requests for assistance in treating wells to make water safe to drink
- Needs for hygiene materials, namely soap in schools
- Questions about cholera and smallpox vaccine

We collected, stored and analysed 2221 Community Feedbacks during this period, many of which had a high occurrence, although they were collected at different times, places and through different information channels. This resulted in 439 for the Far North, 593 for the South West and 1189 for the Littoral.

"We have no water in our community", -Home visit, Bokwango, 27 March 2023

"Distribute pamphlets on which you clearly explain how to administer a sweet and salty solution", -Society National radio program, Douala, 18 March 2023,

"We also want the vaccine against cholera", -Mobile cinema, Bonamoussadi, 20 March 2023

Questions on protective behaviour against the disease

"Are the hunters in the villages who send us meat in town aware of monkeypox?" -- Directed group discussion with volunteers, Bonabéri, 20 March 2023

"Is the vaccine 100% protective against cholera?" - Mobile cinema, Ndogpassi, 20 March 2023

"When will vaccination against monkeypox be available? "- Focus group discussion with volunteers, Bonabéri, 20 March 2023

Observations and beliefs indicating distrust of the response

"It is the end of the world that is near with the appearance of these new diseases without treatment." -Focus group discussion with the community, New-Bell, 21 March 2023

"If veterinarians did their job properly we wouldn't have these diseases today, namely monkey pox and **Ebola".** - Focus group discussion with community, Douala 2, 21 March 2023

"Cholera is a disease of the rich because we poor people are used to dirt." - Awareness raising in schools, Douala 3, 26 March 2023







RECOMMANDATIONS

- Popularise information on monkeypox carrier animals, modes of transmission and symptoms
- Increase awareness and prevention campaigns on cholera and monkeypox, emphasising the need to adopt appropriate measures
- Intensify awareness on how to make water safe to drink and increase the number of drinking water supply points
- Popularize information on cholera and monkeypox (distribution of explanatory leaflets in schools and focus group discussions)
- Produce and broadcast health authority TV awareness messages
- Address the various rumours and beliefs about monkeypox
- Inform the population about cholera treatment sites
